



Print this page: For accurate ring-size results, you must make sure that you do not have “Shrink oversized pages to fit paper size” or “Expand small pages to paper size” selected in the Print dialog box.

Tips for finding your ring size: Measure your finger in warm temperatures at the end of the day. If your knuckle is a lot larger than the base of your finger, use Method 2 below, except measure both the base of your finger and your knuckle and select a size in between the two.

Tips if you’re buying the ring as a surprise: Ask your intended recipient’s friend if they know his/her finger size. Borrow one of your intended recipient’s rings and use Method 1 below.

Other tips and information: Our stainless steel rings cannot be resized. Due to the wide band of our rings, consider moving up a half size from your measurement for comfort. All sizes listed here are standard American sizes. Your ring size will be about half a size larger on your primary hand.

Method 1: Measure against another ring

1. Grab a ring that fits the finger you want to measure
2. Place the ring over the ring silhouettes below. The inner edge of the ring should align with the inner edge of the silhouette.
3. The one that matches the closest is your ring size. If you are between sizes, order the larger size.

21.5 mm x 20.5 mm with a 6 mm band
(inlay dimension: 14.8 mm x 4 mm)



Overall dimension:
23.4 mm x 22 mm with a 6.5 mm band
(inlay dimension: 15.8 mm x 4.3 mm)



Overall dimension:
25.5 mm x 24 mm with a 7 mm band
(inlay dimension: 17.1 mm x 4.5 mm)

Method 2: Measure your finger

1. Carefully cut out the template below
2. Wrap it around your finger and put the pointed end through the slot
3. Pull snugly around the largest part of your finger
4. The number that lines up with the slot is your ring size
